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« Green Resort » label: France's leading ecotourism label



Since 7 June 2017, Peisey-Vallandry has been awarded the «Station Verte» label (for « Green Resort » label) thanks to its responsible stays, in favour of a natural, authentic, human and environmentally friendly tourism. This means developing sustainable initiatives in favour of a respected and preserved nature, proposing a complete offer of activities that enhances the territory's attractiveness as well as engaging in a human tourism of proximity.



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Partner of the Vanoise National Park since 2015



Created in 1963, the Vanoise National Park is the oldest of the French national parks. Its aim is to protect endangered fauna and flora, particularly certain emblematic species such as the ibex. By joining the charter in 2015, Peisey-Vallandry has expressed its support and its desire to participate in this territorial project carried out with a real ambition for sustainable development.



Public transport for soft mobility

Concerned about environmental issues and in order to offer collective travel possibilities to its visitors, Peisey-Vallandry maintains its free shuttle system for a cleaner mobility in the territory, with a lower individual carbon impact. The shuttles pass through Landry and serve all the villages and spots in altitude. New this year: a shuttle linking Vallandry to Arc 1800! Note that the village of Landry has a TGV train station located 15 minutes from the resort. All the more reason to use public transport!



The actions of the Mountain Area in favour of the environment

The Mountain Area Les Arcs / Peisey-Vallandry continues its actions to preserve its natural environment and biodiversity. Whether it is through «planting and reforestation» operations, the steady effort to maintain the «wetlands» (fundamental to buffer during floods and droughts, preserve biodiversity, capture carbon and purify water), the installation of «bird beacons» set on the lifts' infrastructures to indicate them and avoid the possibility of birds colliding, and lastly, the work to optimise the «energy performance» of the ski lift chalets ... A global effort undertaken in the name of sustainability, for the good of the environment and to minimise the impact of man on the ecosystems that make up our wealth.

A CULTURAL SYMPHONY

The territory, well known for its nature and mountains, is also an open-air history book. Full of cultural jewels, it deserves to be explored and discovered to capture its deep identity and rich character.

The «Mountains' Secrets» trip: on the trail of the hidden treasures of the Vanoise

The Foundation for International Cultural Action in the Mountains (FACIM) and the Vanoise Ecotourism Agency have worked hand in hand to create a unique and exceptional stay to discover the Vanoise. Three days of gentle hiking from Rosuel, gateway to the Vanoise National Park, to the hamlets of Sainte-Foy-Tarentaise. In a grandiose setting, the trip will also allow you to get behind the aesthetic varnish and get closer to the sincerity and authenticity of the places - trails, refuges or villages. A more human dimension carried by the generations of

women and men who have written the great history of the Vanoise. Their soul inhabits every corner of the mountain and is revealed at every turn under the precious explanations of their guide who will know, better than anyone else, how to decipher the smallest piece of territory. It will also be an incursion into the local baroque identity that will transport the participants back four centuries. A journey to explore space, expand time and probe the humanity that makes the heart of our mountains beat!



The Sanctuary of Notre-Dame des Vernettes: the jewel of Baroque art in the Tarentaise



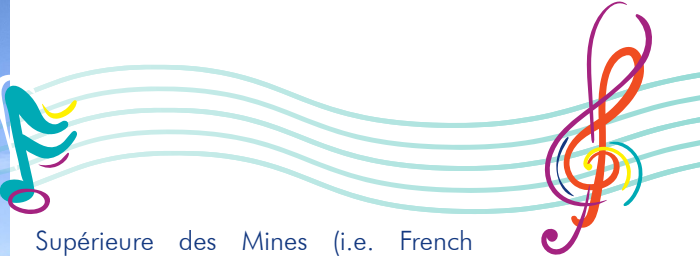
An important place for the locals, Notre-Dame des Vernettes has been part of the landscape for over 300 years. Perched at an altitude of 1,800 m, it has a Marial Sanctuary (the oldest part built in 1720), a guest house, an oratory chapel near the beneficent spring and a Way of the Cross. 5 pilgrimage routes also converge on the site. Located an hour's walk away from the last village, the site is a place of prayer and meetings open and guarded all year round, every day from 9am to 5pm. Classified as a historical monument, it is also a place of extraordinary architecture and aesthetics accessible on foot, with picnic tables on site for eating. A must-see in the area!



The Palais de la Mine: the first French National School of Mining

Peisey has not always been called that. There was a time, not so long ago, when Monts d'Argent (i.e. Mounts of Silver) was its name. This referred to the mining activity, which was very present

in the area. Indeed, the vein of galena (silver lead sulphide) was discovered in 1644 and was exploited until 1866. Between 1802 and 1814, under the Second Empire, the École Nationale



Supérieure des Mines (i.e. French National School of Mining) was even established in Peisey. Today, a museum trail has been installed at Pont-Baudin, on the Monts d'Argent site, to provide information about the exploitation of these lead-silver mines and to explain their importance in the history of the valley. It is here, next to the remains of the installations and the tomb of the Rosenberg knight, that the Palais de la Mine is located - a beautiful building situated on a 3 hectare site, where the student engineers were housed. It is freely accessible all year round, and guided tours are organised - on request or without depending on the time of year. An excursion that is well worth the journey!

The Museum of Mountain Animals: discovering the local fauna and flora



The Museum of Mountain Animals is the result of a joint project between the Vanoise National Park, the Peisey-Vallandry area and the Mountain Area. Together, they imagined a museographic space at altitude dedicated to mountain animals and local flora. With 30 species of fauna, they have made it a place of discovery and awareness appreciated by young and old alike. Educational meetings are also organised from time

to time with Park experts to learn more about the mountain ecosystem. Located at the top of the Vallandry cable car, the Museum is accessible during its opening periods.

Treetop course : an aerial adventure

Immersing yourself in the heart of nature, flying from branch to branch, getting on pine trees... treetop courses are a great way to recharge your batteries deep in nature during a fun moment punctuated by adrenaline rushes! In Peisey-Vallandry, Gli'Air offers a lovely experience through courses for teenagers and adults. 5 evolving courses, 67 workshops from a height of 2 to 22m, a large zip line and a black course for the most adventurous. For this summer, the team has also prepared a few new features: a children's course created at less than 1 metre from the ground for children under 1.10 metres tall. And a new module on the black course: the Quick Flight with a free-fall system!





Guides (Mountain Guides Office) and allowing you to combine climbing with the coolness of the mountain streams: canyoning. Active and entertaining options to enjoy the charms of water and its beneficial energy.

White water: a source of sensations

Water is a precious element and is omnipresent in the area, with the Isère River flowing at the bottom of the valley. This offers a field of expression to those who wish to indulge in the pleasures of water. It is thus possible to set off on the river on a rafting boat or on a hydrospeed with H2O Sports: thrills guaranteed! Another type of water activity, possible via the Bureau des

The via ferrata: vertical fun and thrill

Climbing enthusiasts will also find something to satisfy their thirst for thrills with the via ferrata of Les Bettières. This is located at the gateway to the Vanoise National Park, close to the Rosuel refuge, and is a magnificent route drawn on a ridge line. Spur, exposed ridge, cliffs, slab, Nepalese bridge... a journey to the heart of verticality. It should be noted that the whole route is divided into 3 sections, with possible way outs, in order to remain accessible to all. From «Not Very Difficult» for the first section, which is accessible to children, to «Difficult +» for the third section, including a «Quite Difficult» rating for the intermediate section, there is something for everyone, regardless of their level of experience. No more excuses for not getting out the harnesses!



Bike: a huge playground to enjoy

Whether it's to hurtle down the slopes, ride along the paths or explore the alpine roads, the bicycle occupies a special place in the life of Peisey-Vallandry. It is to summer what skiing is to winter. Surrounded by legendary passes such as the Cormet de Roselend, the Petit-Saint-Bernard and the Iseran, Peisey-Vallandry also offers first-class facilities for mountain biking. A Bike Park, with its network of marked trails ... a delight for mountain bikers. From downhill (DH) to enduro, whether you

are an expert or a beginner, it has been designed to be accessible to all. In total, the Bike Park has 149 km of trails, connected via 10 lifts. 8 DH tracks (1 green, 3 blue, 2 red, 2 black), 8 enduro routes (2 green, 3 blue, 1 red, 2 black), 2 red cross-country routes, 5 electric mountain bike routes (1 green, 1 blue, 3 red) and a pumptrack! A paradise to let the wheels go by.

A HYMN TO ADVENTURE

There is no need to travel to the other side of the world or to sign up for Survivor to experience adventure when you are in a playground like Peisey-Vallandry! Dozens of half-day or multi-day micro-adventures are available. The alternative for a change of scenery without increasing your carbon footprint and to experience unparalleled emotions in the middle of nature.

Bivouac in the Vanoise National Park

What could be more exceptional than spending the night in the oldest national park in France? For only 5 euros, adventurers can bivouac near the refuges and contemplate a preserved nature. Under the benevolent eye of the starry sky, an enchanting spectacle is offered to the Park's guests: wonder guaranteed!



Hiking on the long-distance trail GR5



From the shores of Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean fragrances of the Mercantour foothills, the GR5 crosses the entire Alps over more than 600 kilometres and offers two magnificent stages in the Peisey-Vallandry area. Starting from Landry, these two stages of the GR5 offer a long and gentle climb to the Col du Palet refuge. At the end: a breathtaking panorama of three of the highest peaks in Savoie: the Grande Sassièrè (3,747 m), the Mont-Pourri (3,779 m) and the Grande Casse (3,855 m). After an 8-hour walk, there is no doubt that this moment of relaxation will have a taste of victory for the hikers!



Playing mountaineer for a night

Falling asleep under the stars on the side of a cliff is an unusual experience that the Bureau des Guides invites you to enjoy. This timeless moment of contemplation between sunset and sunrise allows you to admire the stars and their constellations. From the front row, spectators will be able to observe the reflections of the last light of the day on the Mont Blanc and the surrounding mountains: a unique visual spectacle!

Sleeping in a yurt on the edge of a lake



The Entre-le-Lac refuge, a former sheepfold built in 1980, is located on the Tarentaise side of the Vanoise National Park. A well-known landmark for walkers on the GR5 route, the refuge enjoys an exceptional setting. At an altitude of 2,145 m, it borders the Plagne lake, source of the Ponthurin, which drains the Peisey-Vallandry valley. No one can remain indifferent to the discovery of this mountain lake with its turquoise water. In this idyllic setting, Franck invites his guests to spend a night in a yurt. An unusual experience between lake and starry sky... to be lived preferably accompanied!

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The Go Alpine Chalet tiny house

The tiny house, by definition, is a small dwelling. It is a kind of miniature lodging halfway between a caravan and a house with all the comforts. In recent years, tiny houses have become very popular because of the eco-friendly and minimalist lifestyle they offer. Cathy and Mark Gardiner's house is simply sublime. Inspired by traditional Savoyard architecture, this tiny house is a real gem. Available for 4 people for a minimum of two nights on a self-catering basis, this mini-cottage is ideally located 20 metres from the GR5 trail at Le Villaret.



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The solidarity gite La Maison Pains d'Épices

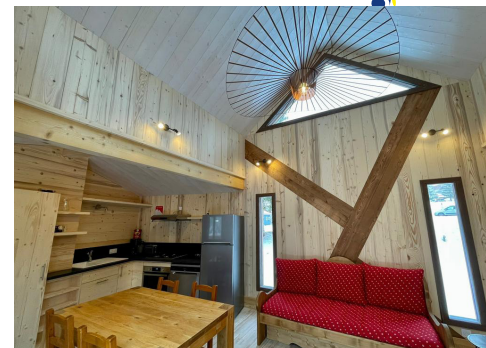


A first in the region, the solidarity gite La Maison Pains d'Épices (i.e. Gingerbread House), located in Landry, offers accommodation adapted to vulnerable or fragile people, so that they too can enjoy the benefits of the mountains. There were no organizations in Haute-Tarentaise bringing solutions to families who have to deal with mental illnesses. The association Nature, Expression et Création has decided to remedy this situation by creating the gîte La Maison Pains d'Épices. Why this name? Because bread represents sharing and ginger with other spices represent diversity, which, when brought together, form something new. For the moment, a room for two or three people is available on the ground floor of the house. Further work is planned to accommodate up to 10 people.

The chalets at Camping des Lanchettes



In a natural setting, at the gateway to the Vanoise National Park, Les Lanchettes campsite is a real haven of peace. For an ideal moment to share with family or friends, the establishment will inaugurate two new chalets this summer: the Kailloux chalet and the chalet Le Nid. Chalet Kailloux is a wood-frame chalet for 6 people, with three bedrooms, two bathrooms, a fully equipped kitchen, a terrace with mountain and forest views and a Nordic bath, ideal to relax after a long day of mountain biking or hiking. Next door, the small chalet Le Nid has a double bedroom, bathroom and sitting area. This accommodation can be rented on its own, like a hotel room, or can be rented as a complement to the Kailloux chalet.



The Cour aux Eureuils tourist residence

This avant-garde establishment will offer 50 tourist accommodation units, from T2 to T6, as well as an independent chalet, which will enhance the accommodation offer in the Plan Peisey sector. In order to guarantee a top-of-the-range stay for guests, the emphasis will be set on the layout of the flats' living spaces. Particular attention will be paid to the kitchen and living areas in order to provide maximum ergonomics and space for guests. An indoor playground for children, as well as a wellness area with a breathtaking view over the valley, consisting of an indoor swimming pool, a sauna, a hammam and a fitness room will complete the offer. In order to park their vehicles inside and in complete safety during their stay, guests will also benefit from an underground garage.

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The Esquilo bakery

The Esquilo bakery is actually two bakeries/pastry shops. With two points of sale, one in the village of Peisey and one in Vallandry, a cocktail of good products offers its flavours to the taste buds of gourmets. Breads, pastries, viennoiseries, the bakery also offers its services for festive events. Be it weddings or christenings, birthdays and other festive days, this is the place to be! The Vallandry bakery is open during the winter season, while the one in the village of Peisey remains open all year round.



The Sherpa in Plan Peisey

A new shop has joined the Sherpa family in Peisey-Vallandry. In the heart of the new Les Cristaux Blancs residence, the Sherpa Plan Peisey will delight early morning mountain dwellers everyday with homemade bread and pastries freshly baked in the shop's own laboratory from 7.30am! Ideal to fill up on energy before starting the day! At lunchtime, the shop will offer a full range of snacks to satisfy everyone's tastes. Throughout the season, 250 m2 will be dedicated to fresh and local products that will await visitors to the store. With a view to «zero plastic», the store will follow the line of the new Sherpa concepts.

The wine cellar Ambiance Cave

Frédéric Mauduit has launched an innovative and unique concept in Peisey-Vallandry: Ambiance Cave. Located at the foot of the Les Cristaux Blancs residence, it is the first wine cellar and tasting room in the resort. At noon, holidaymakers can meet there for a little break with oysters and seafood tasting on the terrace. In the evening, the place will be open on reservation only and privatized. Frédéric will adapt to the needs of the guests by thinking up a tailor-made tasting solution. On the solid side, cold cuts and cheese boards, or an assortment of fondues to visit the local gastronomy. On the liquid side, a selection of the best wines and producers - such as Domaine Bouvet in Savoie. Local beers and tasting rums will complete the offer.

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The Peiserote micro-brewery

Since the 2022 summer season, Peisey-Vallandry has had the pleasure of having its own beer brewed on-site, the Peiserote, result of the work and passion of Julia Pagès. After 15 years in the Lyon region working as an accountant, life led her to settle in Peisey. Eager for a change, and having brewed her first beers, which were appreciated by her entourage, she decided to embark on the adventure. On the way, she trained as a brewer at the agricultural school in Douai and really wanted to make Peisey beer, so she set up her micro-brewery. 4 beers are made with local untreated water: an IPA (more hoppy), a red (with roasted malt), a white (with notes of coriander and orange) and the great classic lager to complete the range. While waiting to obtain the title of Master Brewer, which will enable her to develop on a larger scale, Peisey-Vallandry already has something to make beer lovers happy.



The Kitz restaurant

The Kitz is a new restaurant available to holidaymakers visiting Peisey-Vallandry. Short for Kitzbühel, the name of the restaurant reflects its links with Austria. Sitting down at the Kitz will then be an opportunity to taste rare dishes in our country but which are the pride of Austrian tables: the Knödel or the Apfelstrudel! A culinary break that will transport gourmets to the Tyrol for a few bites. For a yodel of pleasure!



A FAMILY MELODY

Whether they are cheese makers, shopkeepers or restaurateurs, they all have one thing in common: they are living witnesses to the heritage of Peisey-Vallandry. Let's take a look at these privileged actors who have been writing the history of the destination for several generations.

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The Alpine GAEC Farm



Born in 2006 from the union of the GAECs of Croix-Bozon (Scalia family) and Vallon des Rossets (Poccard family), the alpine GAEC of Peisey-Vallandry is a unique and lasting family adventure. Today, it is composed of 5 partners from both families (Pierre, Clément and Anaïs Poccard, Catherine and Jérôme Scalia). Pierre is Catherine's brother. Clément and Anaïs are the children of Pierre and Anne-Sophie Poccard. Jérôme is the son of Catherine and Serge Scalia, whose marriage sealed the union of the two GAECs. One and the same family, active since 1918 and forming the 4th generation of cheese makers. Producers of Raclette and Tomme de Savoie, their real pride is the Beaufort Chalet d'Alpage - produced at a minimum altitude of 1,500 m, with milk from a single herd and immediately after milking, i.e. twice a day. The GAEC is one of 17 producers of this cheese, made in the family's mountain pasture at an altitude between 2,000 and 2,600 metres, where the family stays 110 days a year.

The Shop Noz Sports - Sport 2000



The shop Noz Sports - Sport 2000, a real family saga as we like them in Peisey-Vallandry. Yvon and Suzanne (the parents of Philippe and Stéphanie, the current managers) were at the origin of a crazy project initiated in 1965: a bar with a ski shop on the ground floor, the Ski Bar. All the bon vivants who loved skiing could converge there to share a drink and hire equipment. In 1974, Yvon and Suzanne launched a new concept: a hut dedicated to the sale and rental of mountain equipment, which was located next to a local institution, the Chez Félix restaurant. They were then joined by Philippe, who took over the family business in 1984, and by Stéphanie, who bought another shop with him five years later. Together they managed these two shops from 1989 to 2003 before building their last Noz Sports - Sport 2000 shop in 2009. The Noz family: 60 years of passion for the mountains!

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The Intersport shops



The history of Intersport shops goes back 70 years for the Collin family (Octave and his brother Roger) who ran a small grocery shop in the village: the Maison Savoyarde. At the origin of the development of the first ski lift, the family also opened a sports shop. Later, Annie and Gérard Collin (Octave's son) with two other partners perpetuated this development by creating a small fondue restaurant/music bar: l'Écurie. Then new outlets were opened in Nancroix, Plan Peisey and Vallandry, which became Sherpa and Intersport. Gérard, a local character who was a shopkeeper, president of

the Tourist Office and of the Sivom, mayor of Peisey, founding member of the folk group Les Cordettes and ski instructor, passed the torch to his daughter, Delphine, for Intersport. The Sherpa business was taken over by Fred Mauduit, current president of the Peisey-Vallandry Tourist Office. For Delphine, the brand must rhyme with passion and family transmission. As the mother of two teenage daughters, the next generation will perhaps be assured!

The Col du Palet restaurant



The Col du Palet is a family history that goes back to 1904! This former cartwright's workshop was transformed into a bar-restaurant almost 120 years ago by the great-grandfather of the current manager! In 1921, rooms were added to create the Hôtel de la Gare, which became the Col du Palet in the late 1930s. Today, this name refers to the restaurant part and there are furnished flats for rent under the name of Chardon Bleu. Bénédicte Romanet, the manager, is carrying on a beautiful family history, taking over from Joseph Romanet (the great-grandfather and founder), Théophile (the grandfather) and Charles (the father). Just like the traditional recipes, the restaurant crosses generations with a generous family cuisine that is not about to stop!

The restaurants Chez Félix

Chez Félix was the first restaurant ever built in the resort in 1965. It was originally a small wooden hut that sold « crêpes » (pancakes) prepared with sugar (0.80 franc) and Grand Marnier (1.20 francs) only! Faced with the success of the winter season, Félix Blanc decided to open another crêperie Chez Félix in Rosuel in the summer of 1966, the first restaurant located at the gateway to the Vanoise National Park. After 33 years behind his crepe maker, Félix handed over the apron to his son Yannick Blanc in 1998. Today, the latter is the owner and manager of Chez Félix in Plan Peisey. He has left the management of the Rosuel restaurant to his son Marvin and has been assisted for more than 10 years by his daughter Mathilde, who will someday take over in Plan Peisey. As Mathilde and Marvin also have children, the future of the restaurants already seems to be set!

In 2003, the Paradiski ski area was born, and with its 425 km of pistes, it has since become one of the largest and most coveted in the world.

The construction of the Vanoise Express cable car sealed the marriage between the La Plagne and Les Ares/Peisey-Vallandry sectors, giving life to this ski paradise. With a total length of 1,824 m, it travels at a maximum height of 380 m and can reach a speed of 45 km/h. The lift also held the capacity record until 2016, with a capacity of 200 passengers and one cabin crew for a flow rate of 2,000 people per hour (per direction of travel).

It will then be 20 years next winter since the Vanoise Express, and therefore Paradiski, came into being. On this occasion, the festivities will be in full swing to remember this key moment in the history of the area and its inhabitants. An anniversary not to be missed...
